Happy Birthday to Us: Celebrate MCUM's 80 Years with a Gift to our Endowment

MCUM is like a tree – as an agency, we bear the fruit of helping families get out of generational poverty, but to do that we require a lasting legacy of community support in order to ensure survival through the toughest of conditions.

Thanks to this community support, MCUM has now provided essential services to Monroe County residents for 80 years. MCUM welcomes support in a variety of forms, but the support that will help our tree's roots stay firmly planted for many more years into the future is that of MCUM's endowment.

"What is an endowment?," you ask. It is a fund we have, held at the Community Foundation of Bloomington & Monroe County, that grows and grows, distributing a small percentage of funds to the agency each year. It is set up to ensure MCUM can exist for as long as our services are needed. Last year, MCUM received over \$27,000 for our annual endowment distribution – the equivalent of subsidizing a full preschool classroom. By growing our endowment, we grow our annual distribution!

This year, we have been selected to participate in an opportunity through the Community Foundation of Bloomington & Monroe County and the Lily Foundation to receive proportional matching funds on donations made to our endowment. Our goal is to raise \$15,000 and receive another \$7,500 from the Lily Foundation, adding a total of \$22,500 to our endowment.

Compass Early Learning Center	Self-Sufficiency Center
212 children attended our Compass Early Learning Centers last year.	6,784 have received meals, clothing/household vouchers, financial assistance, and cleaning or hygiene items so far this year.
74% of graduating preschoolers were deemed "school-ready."	83% reported feeling less anxiou about their ability to meet their basic needs after visiting MCUM.
75% of daily nutritional needs are provided to children in our care.	\$13,209 invested into personal savings accounts by the 9 individuals enrolled in MCUM's asset-building opportunity.

Just take a look at Amy*. A single mom struggling to make payments for her two children's care at Compass Early Learning Center, frustrated and exhausted, Amy decided to learn more about MCUM's Self-Sufficiency Center at our recent information session. Thanks to contributions from supporters like you, we enrolled her in our new Your Path program. Since February, Amy has been working with her self-sufficiency coach and has gained a higher-paying job she enjoys, enrolled in part time college courses, and has made her first deposit into her Individual Development Account (IDA), which will be matched in August, enabling her to make a down payment on her Habitat for Humanity Home.

Amy can't say thanks, but we can! Here at MCUM, we are so grateful to have supporters like you making stories like these a possibility for working families.

Today, we embark on our Summer Campaign. Our goal is to subsidize the cost of care for 16 preschoolers and provide their parents with the wrap-around services like Amy received.

We are launching our second-annual Summer Campaign to help us positively-influence the lives of the families we serve. Will you help?

With your support, we can eliminate generational poverty in Monroe County – starting with these 16 families like Amy's.
